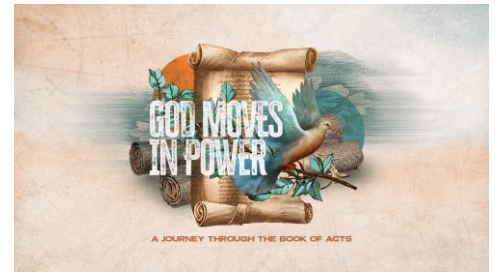

Overview

The sermon series “God Moves in Power” is a journey through the book of Acts, where we witness the Holy Spirit at work through prayer, the gospel, the Church, and ordinary people. As we explore the story of the early church, we’ll discover that the same God who moved powerfully then is still moving today. This series will challenge and encourage us to live with bold faith, expectant prayer, and a willingness to join God’s ongoing mission in the world. The story of Acts is far from over and we’re invited to be a part of it.

Stephen, the first Christian martyr, recounts the faithfulness of God throughout the ages and shows how it is ultimately fulfilled in Jesus. While God’s track record is one of faithfulness, the track record of His people is often hard-heartedness—something we must repent of to be part of what God is doing today. How does the gospel work through the mediums of message and martyrdom?
